### [Blessing with holy water]

In the waters of baptism, Sister Mary Pius died with Christ and rose with him to new life. May she now share with him eternal glory. As St. Paul has written: "All of us who were baptized into Christ were baptized into his death. By baptism into his death we were buried together with him, so that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life. For if we have been united with him by likeness to his death, so shall we be united with him by likeness to his resurrection."

On the day of her baptism, Sister Mary Pius put on Christ. On the day of Christ's coming, may she be clothed with glory.
