Celebrant:

Praised be God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all consolation! God comforts us in all our afflictions and thus enables us to comfort those who are in trouble, with the same consolation we have received from God.

[Blessing with holy water]

In the waters of baptism, Sister Mary died with Christ and rose with him to new life. May she now share with him eternal glory. As St. Paul has written: "All of us who were baptized into Christ were baptized into his death. By baptism into his death we were buried together with him, so that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life. For if we have been united with him by likeness to his death, so shall we be united with him by likeness to his resurrection."

At this meal which we share in the name of your Son, we hear once more your pledge of life which will never come to an end. So may we bless your name with him now and forever. Amen.


Presentation Song: BREASTPLATE OF ST. PATRICK
